## Supervisors Approve Contract for Lake Gregory Clubhouse Renovations

**SAN BERNARDINO** – On Tuesday, the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors approved a \$294,838 contract to completely renovate a lakeside County building so it can be used for various community functions in the Crestline area.

The building – a former bathhouse built in the 1950s on Lake Gregory’s eastern shore – will undergo numerous safety and cosmetic improvements during the renovations, which are scheduled to begin in April and are expected to be completed in late June.

The renovations will include updating the building’s restrooms to meet Americans with Disabilities Act standards, replacing ceiling lights with energy-saving light fixtures, upgrading the kitchen to comply with health code requirements, replacing windows, and repainting the facility, which is also known as the Leisure Shores Clubhouse.

“The building’s prime location on Lake Gregory and next to the Little League baseball fields make it a very valuable community resource, and this County investment will help preserve and enhance the facility so Crestline residents can use it for years to come,” said San Bernardino County Second District Supervisor Paul Biane, who secured Community Development Block Grant funding for the project.

The Crest Forest Senior Citizens Club was using the building for meetings and events until 2006 when a storm water drainage problem caused extensive damage to the facility. Since then, the County has improved and increased drainage capacity to prevent future storm damage to the building.

The \$294,838 contract was awarded to KRC Construction of Rancho Cucamonga, which was deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bidder out of the 12 bids received.

In addition to awarding the renovation contract, the Board of Supervisors also authorized plans to repair and improve the building parking lot, which is also used by fishermen at Lake Gregory and by people utilizing the nearby baseball fields. The project will include new paving, striping, parking spaces, and improved drainage.
